What is National Night Out?

National Night Out started in 1984 as a project launched by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW), a nonprofit organization aimed at preventing crime. The NATW partnered with law enforcement agencies and neighborhood watch associations to organize National Night Out. Held locally and in the evening, the event sent a strong message to criminals that the community stood united in a common cause.

Now in its 33rd year, National Night Out 2016 continues to challenge communities to pull together to host their own event. Safer neighborhoods are created with vested and vigilant citizens.
