REGULAR MEETING – WEDNESDAY, May 1, 2019

1. CALL TO ORDER

The Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Commission met in a Regular Session at 7:01 p.m., Wednesday, May 1, 2019, in the Council Chambers, 3191 Katella Ave., Chair Olveda presiding.

Motion Carried: The Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Commission approved the Regular Meeting of February 6, 2019 and March 6, 2019.

6. STAFF REPORTS

A. Facility and Park Maintenance Update

Recreation Manager Ron Noda provided the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Commission with a biannual update on facility and park maintenance. The report listed all maintenance and repair activities and yielding the opportunity for the Commission to provide feedback to staff on current and future maintenance concerns they may have. Development Services Director Les Johnson, was present to introduce himself to the Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Arts Commission and to answer any questions they might have.

B. Proposition 68

Recreation Manager, Ron Noda provided the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Commission with information on California Proposition 68 - the Parks, Environment, and Water Bond. The General Election vote supported the measure to authorize \$4 billion in general obligation bonds for state and local parks, environmental protection projects, water infrastructure projects, and flood protection projects. Staff is seeking recommendations from the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission on how they would like to utilize the money if the City of Los Alamitos was awarded any funding.

The Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission initially voted on utilizing the potential funding, if received, on enhancements to the Community Center. Staff is seeking alternative direction from the PR&CA Commission for alternative recommendations as current discussion of plans for a potential new Civic Center including the Community Center has been discussed. The PR&CA Commission voted and recommended the following (Motion/Second: Doby/Hunter):

- Re-surfacing of the Laurel Park Tennis Courts (including a Pickleball Court)
- Labourdette Park Project
- Renovation of the Little Cottonwood Softball Diamond

The PR&CA Commission requested staff a report listing the Recreation CIP List for 2019-2020 at the next scheduled meeting.

C. Race on the Base 2019

Recreation Manager Emeline Noda provided the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission with an update of the Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department 2019 Race on the Base. The Los Alamitos Race on the Base is the City's largest special event and draws thousands of people to Los Alamitos. Race on the Base events include the popular 95.9 The Fish Reverse Triathlon, Jr. Reverse Triathlon, 10K Run, Honoring Our Fallen 5K Run/Walk with the Virtual 5K, 10K Wheelchair Race, and the popular Southland Credit Union Glow in the Dark Whimsical Fun Run. This year was the 38th annual event featuring military static displays with live music throughout the course, post-race food, a two-day Health & Fitness Vendor Expo, free race clinics, and newly designed traditional finisher medals and sublimated shirts that had a patriotic theme.

Sponsors play a significant role in the Race on the Base, not only financially, but also by helping to spread the word about the event to the patrons who frequent their businesses. The final amount in cash received and in in-kind sponsorships decreased due to Southland Credit Union's vacancy of title sponsorship.

Staff will add the following recommendations to the 2020 ROTB Event:

1. Submit Forms to State for Military Static Displays in April/May
2. Solicit static displays once approval is received
3. See about working with a race car group for static displays to attract a different crowd in addition to current participants

The winners of the 2019 Race on the Base Council & Commission Participation Challenge was awarded to Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission with the Largest Number Attending the event of six Commissioners and Highest Percentage of Participation at 85%. A plaque was presented to the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission at the April 15, 2019 City Council Meeting.

- Senior Prom's Enchanted Forest will take place on Saturday, May 11, 2019 for Ages 50+ at the Los Alamitos Community Center. Tickets are currently on sale at the Community Center.

SUMMARY

This report provides the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission a preview of the Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department's 2019 Music and Movie Event Series.

RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

The Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department annually holds four (4) Music and Movies events during the summer months. MemorialCare Miller Children's & Women's Hospital Long Beach is the title sponsor for the 2019 event series. All four events are free to attend and provides the community with a fun-filled evening of activities including a live band, children's activities, and arts and crafts followed by a movie.

DISCUSSION

The Recreation and Community Services Department along with the Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Arts Commission invites the community to attend one or all of the MemorialCare Miller Children's & Women's Hospital Long Beach Music and Movies Event Series with family, neighbors, and friends.

There will be four (4) events during the summer months and all events will begin at 6:30pm with live entertainment with the movie beginning at approximately 8:00pm. The dates and locations are below:

- Saturday, June 15, 2019 at Little Cottonwood Park
- Saturday, June 29, 2019 at Sunburst Field at the Joint Forces Training Base
- Saturday, July 13, 2019 at Orville R. Lewis Park
- Saturday, July 27, 2019 at the Los Alamitos School District Office Field

The Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Arts Commission provided input and made the following recommendations for the movies at the February 6, 2019 commission meeting.

June 15 at Little Cottonwood Park

The Music and Movie Event held on June 15 at Little Cottonwood Park (4000 Farquhar Avenue) will feature the band Southland Mega Groove. After the live entertainment, the featured movie for the night will be Trolls. The event will also feature two bounce houses, a themed photo area, and the "Crazy Hair Company" coming out and styling kids with crazy hair to mimic the trolls in the movie. Domino's Pizza, Speedy Dog Hot Dogs, and Yogurtland will be the food vendors for the evening.

June 29 at Sunburst Field at the Joint Forces Training Base

The Music and Movie event scheduled for June 29 at Sunburst Field at the Joint Forces Training Base (4370 Farquhar Avenue) will have live music provided by the 4 Alarm Band. The featured movie for the night will be Star Wars: The Force Awakens. The event will have two bounce houses, a themed photo area, an arts & craft area featuring Star Wars Legos, and a dress up contest. Attendees are encouraged to come dressed as their favorite Star Wars character for a chance to win a prize. Frankie's Frozen Treats, Yogurtland, and Los Alamitos Youth Baseball's snack shack will be the food vendors for the evening.

July 13 at Orville R. Lewis Park

The event scheduled for July 13 at Orville R. Lewis Park (3662 Kempton Drive) and presented by Randy Hill, Realtor will have live music from the Mike Sullivan Band. The band will also be raffling off a guitar to an audience member. The featured movie for the night will be Wreck-It-Ralph: Ralph Breaks the Internet. The event will have two bounce houses, an arts & craft area, a themed photo area, and a video game truck from 6:30pm-8:00pm. Fiesta Gourmet Food Truck, Speedy Dog Hot Dogs, Frankie's Frozen Treats, and Yogurtland will be the food vendors for the evening.

July 27 at the Los Alamitos School District Office Field

The event scheduled for July 27 at the Los Alamitos School District Field (10293 Bloomfield Street) will have live music from the band – Hollywood Blonde. The featured movie for the night will be Disney’s Incredibles 2. The event will have two bounce houses, a themed photo area, and a visit from Elastagirl herself. Domino’s Pizza, Fiesta Gourmet Food Truck, Frankie’s Frozen Treats, and Yogurtland will be the food vendors for the evening.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for the event is provided by the Recreation and Community Services Department budget, under the “special event” line item. MemorialCare Miller Children’s & Women’s Hospital Long Beach is the title sponsor for all four events with Randy Hill, Realtor being the presenting sponsor for the July 13 date at Orville R. Lewis Park. Their sponsorship will assist with enhancing and also offsetting the cost for the events. City staff will continue to supplement the City's funding by seeking food trucks, vendors, and additional sponsors.

Subject: 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular Preview 2019

SUMMARY

This report provides the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission with information regarding the upcoming 32nd annual 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular scheduled for Thursday, July 4, 2019 at the Joint Forces Training Base.

RECOMMENDATION

Commission receive and file.

BACKGROUND

The annual 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular will be held at the Joint Forces Training Base (JFTB), marking its 32nd year of the event. It is co-sponsored by the cities of Los Alamitos, Seal Beach, and the Joint Forces Training Base.

Approximately 15,000 people attend the free event to celebrate America's birthday by viewing a spectacular firework display. The main stage will have live entertainment provided by the 40th Infantry Division Band and The King Salmon Band. The event will once again be held on the airfield with parking on the tarmac.

DISCUSSION

Request for the Memorandum of Agreement (M.O.A.) between the Joint Forces Training Base and the City of Los Alamitos to be amended to include separate attachments for use of the Airfield and contribution have been submitted to California State military officials. Staff has also submitted Form 2535 and 2535 requesting static displays for aerial equipment and ground vehicles as well as the color guard and other military support. This

year, there has been some leadership changes which has caused a slight delay in obtaining approval of partnership funds to support the event.

Sponsors

Sponsorships are a large source of revenue to support the 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular. A total of \$46,500 was secured in 2018. This year, the City of Cypress has pulled out of the partnership as well as the Community of Rossmoor. Cypress contributed a significant source of in-kind support in staffing and their showmobile and Rossmoor contributed \$8,000 in cash. A total of \$36,000 has been secured from the following 2019 sponsors:

Vendors

Staff is currently recruiting food and commercial vendors for the 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular. All vendors must submit paperwork and be considered to the Army and Air Force Exchange Service (AAFES). Once AAFES approves the vendors, they will then be directed by City staff. Some of the food vendors that have been confirmed for the 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular are:

Family Area

The Family Area will be open from 4:00pm to 8:00pm and feature activities for the family to enjoy. A second stage will be in the family area and it will host a magic show performance beginning at 6:00pm. The second stage will also feature a donut eating

contest and a pie eating contest. Other activities will include large games such as corn hole, "Jenga", and "Connect Four." Free Face painters and balloon twisters will also be located in the Family Area.

Below is the tentative timeline of the event:

- 4:00pm Event officially begins
- 4:15-6:00pm King Salmon Band at the main stage
- 4:00pm Family Area Open
- 6:00-7:00pm Magic Show at the second stage in the Family Area
- 6:00-7:45pm 40th ID Band at the main stage
- 7:45pm Dignitary Speeches
- 8:00pm Family Area Closes
- 8:00-9:00pm 40 ID Band at the main stage
- 9:00pm Fireworks Show begins
- 9:30pm Event Concludes

The Los Alamitos City Council, Commission members, and the community are invited to the Joint Forces Training Base to celebrate the 2019 4th of July. The event will have live music, food that will be available to purchase, and concludes with a 22-minute long fireworks show beginning promptly at 9:00 pm. The general public's entrance onto the Joint Forces Training Base will be on Lexington Drive and Orangewood Avenue. It is recommended for City Council and Commission members to enter the base via the Orangewood entrance.

FISCAL IMPACT

Staff is working with the JFTB to reduce expenditures and increase revenue for the 2019 4th of July Spectacular. Staff is currently working with companies to obtain quotes for equipment rentals (light towers, port-a-potty units, traffic equipment rental, etc.) and contracted services (parking personnel, security, etc.). The JFTB is providing the licensing for the installation in-kind again this year due to the patriotic nature of the event and the partnership for the event. However, due to the loss of the City of Cypress and the Community of Rossmoor, there are increased costs in security, event staff and rental of the stage this year. Due to some new regulations with Race on the Base net gain proceeds, the proceeds have been determined that they must benefit soldiers or the funds will need to go towards the U.S. Department of Treasury. Staff has determined that the 4th of July event does benefit soldiers with the patriotic holiday and the event will be offset by the Race on the Base net gain proceeds by approximately \$30,000.

BACKGROUND

The Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department is developing a new Loyalty Program sponsored by MemorialCare Miller Children's and Women's Hospital Long Beach. Participants can sign up for the Loyalty Program to receive benefits year-round and be rewarded for signing up for multiple programs and classes. The program is designed similar to other private industry rewards programs or customer loyalty programs.

DISCUSSION

The Loyalty Program is proposed for a fee of \$49 (resident) or \$52 (non-resident) per family per year. Once a family signs up for the program, they will receive an intro gift (to be determined). Benefits for being a member of the Loyalty Program include:

 - Parent Night Out
- Waived fees
 - Transfer fees (\$10)
 - Refund fees (\$6)

- Contests for experiences
 - Start a race at Race on the Base
 - Emcee an event
 - Photo session of family at an event
 - Police escort
 - Police ride along
- Swag
 - Intro gift
 - Holiday gift
 - Raffle prizes
- Priority Registration 3 days prior
- 50% off Family Dance tickets
- 20% off of City merchandise
- 10% discount off of Youth and Adult Sports
- Preferred parking at City events including:
 - Race on the Base
 - 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular

FISCAL IMPACT

The Loyalty Program is expected to generate revenue for the Recreation and Community Services Department overall. The cost of the benefits for the Loyalty Program will be offset by the revenue and the sponsorship from MemorialCare Miller Children's and Women's Hospital Long Beach (\$12,500).

Capital Improvement Projects (C.I.P.) is a planning document that identifies projects and equipment purchases. The City of Los Alamitos C.I.P. list helps maintain or improve City infrastructure whether it is new construction, expansion, renovation, or replacement.
