

6. STAFF REPORTS

A. Update on the Interstate 605 (I-605)/Katella Avenue Interchange Improvement Project

This report serves as an update to the Interstate 605 (I-605) and Katella Avenue Interchange Improvement Project. Currently the project is in the RFP Proposal phase to select a design consultant for the preparation of plans and specifications for the project. The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA), in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the City of Los Alamitos, has issued the Request for Proposals (RFP). Proposals have been received and are being evaluated to select a consultant

City Engineer Kelley summarized the staff report.

Commissioner Hill and City Engineer Kelley discussed how the project includes a bike lane along Katella Avenue near the interchange and how it is up to the consultants to solve having a bike lane on both sides of Katella Avenue.

Commissioner Singer mentioned that there is not a path of connectivity for bikes and pedestrians to the west of Katella Avenue. City Engineer Kelley clarified that this is something the consultants are trying to solve and to also include crosswalks for each ramp.

Chair Patz mentioned that previously it was previously discussed to build a pedestrian bridge going over Katella Avenue from Rossmoor to Oak Middle School. City Engineer Kelley shared that it may have been an alternative but was rejected.

Commissioner Hill shared that Katella Avenue and Wallingsford is a busy intersection and kids from Oak Middle School and [Los Alamitos] High School going to and from Rossmoor cross this area. He suggested that there would be a huge dent in safety and efficiency of Katella Avenue if there was a way to prevent a long string of kids from blocking the intersection for so long.

The Traffic Commission, City Engineer Kelley, and Traffic Engineer Iranitalab discussed the following:

- Concern of the safety of kids crossing such a long street (Katella Avenue).
- The traffic signal timing at the intersection of Katella Avenue and Wallingsford.

- How an overpass on Katella Avenue would alleviate the issue.

Vice Chair Mejia and City Engineer Iranitalab discussed the striping on Wallingsford, but Commissioner Coxhill clarified that the street is not in the City of Los Alamitos.

Commissioner Hill asked for clarification of paragraph 3 on page 2 of the staff report:

“On westbound Katella Avenue, the ramp termini of the northbound entrance and loop exist ramps would be reconfigured to eliminate the existing free right-turn movements and the short merge at the ramp entrance.”

Traffic Engineer Iranitalab and City Engineer Kelley clarified that it would turn this area into a T-intersection.

Commissioner Singer and City Engineer Kelley discussed the purpose of this project is to enhance pedestrian and bicycle access and to make the interchange safer for pedestrians and bicyclists.

Commissioner Hill and City Engineer discussed the merge lane when on Willow Street going northbound 605.

SUMMARY

This report provides the Traffic Commission with information regarding the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) Active Transportation Program (ATP) Grant Project. The report also requests input into the nomination and appointment of one commissioner to serve on the Community Advisory Council (CAC).

RECOMMENDATION

1. Discuss the Active Transportation Program (ATP) Grant Project; and,
2. Nominate and appoint a representative from the Traffic Commission for the Community Advisory Council (CAC).

BACKGROUND

Since 2005, the Sustainability Planning Grants Program (formerly known as Compass Blueprint) has strengthened partnerships with cities and local municipalities by providing consultant services as well as financial and technical resources for selected projects, free of charge. The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) accepted applications for the Sustainability Planning Grants Program in 2016. City of Los Alamitos Staff and interns applied for this SCAG Grant in November 2016. The City was not immediately awarded the grant and was placed on a waitlist until 2019 when the City was notified that the grant is now funded.

With the grant, the City desires to establish bike and pedestrian-friendly environment throughout the City through the creation of a Community-wide Active Transportation Plan (ATP). The ATP will support and inform ActiveOC, Orange County's Bike and Pedestrian Plan being developed by the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA). It will address specific issues related to bicycle elements, pedestrian elements, Safe Routes to School (SRTS), and regional connections. Improving

conditions for walking and bicycling within the City of Los Alamitos would provide residents with greater access to jobs, goods, and services without the use of an automobile. Increasing the percentage of trips made by bicycling and walking will reduce overall VMT (Vehicle Miles Travelled) and GHG (Greenhouse Gas) emissions.

The SCAG grant award to the City is for \$150,000.00. The City does not receive those funds directly. SCAG pays those monies, as well as a \$15,000.00 match that the City provided, directly to a consultant who will conduct the work under the supervision of City Staff. The Consulting firm selected for this project by SCAG is KTUA, and Latino Health Access assists them. Tonight, KTUA requests that the Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Arts Commission nominate and appoint a Commissioner as a member of the Community Advisory Committee (CAC) for the SCAG ATP Grant.

DISCUSSION

The City of Los Alamitos, along with the consultant KTUA, has recently launched the planning process for the Los Alamitos Active Transportation Plan (ATP). The goal of the ATP is to evaluate the City's streets so that it can successfully plan for safe and accessible walking, biking, and "rolling" environments.

One member of the Traffic Commission is invited to participate in a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) where the Commissioner, on behalf of the Traffic Commission will have an opportunity to share their knowledge and experience with anything related to active transportation. The Commissioner will be asked to attend (in-person or virtually pending COVID-19 health guidelines) approximately six (6) meetings during the ATP's 10-month process. Each meeting will cover a different topic and the feedback collected will help shape the final ATP.

The role of CAC members will include:

- Providing feedback at each meeting
- Representing the values and viewpoints of the community
- Sharing ATP-related information to friends, neighbors, and social networks
- Encouraging others to participate in outreach events

Below is the tentative CAC schedule:

CAC #1 Mid/Late July 2020

- Topic: Introductions, ATP Overview/Goals, Outreach Feedback

CAC #2: Mid/Late August 2020

- Topic: Present Existing Conditions Analysis, Outreach Feedback, Walk Audit

CAC #3: Late September 2020

- Topic: Review Potential List of Projects, Outreach Feedback, Walk Audit

CAC #4: Late October 2020

- Topic: Review Design Concepts

CAC #5: Mid November/Early December 2020

- Topic: Review ATP Programs and Implementation Strategies

CAC #6: Mid January 2021

- Topic: TBD

Subject: Update on the Street Sweeping Schedule and Frequency Associated with Parking (citywide)

SUMMARY

This report serves as an update to the Traffic Commission regarding a request from Commissioner Singer during the May 13th Traffic Commission meeting, concerning the City's current street sweeping schedule. In its current form, certain areas of the City have street sweeping on both sides of the street on the same day, which poses parking challenges for residents.

RECOMMENDATION

Receive and discuss.

BACKGROUND

For background, on April 27, 1981, the City Council first passed a resolution to establish limited no parking zones to accommodate street sweeping within residential areas throughout the City. Since then, the resolution has been modified twice, with the most recent scheduled adoption of Resolution No. 1928 on July 14, 2003 (Attachment 1).

It is noted that back in 2018, a request was made from a resident in the Country Square neighborhood, asking for the City to explore options for modifying the existing limited parking zones, which accommodate street sweeping in the neighborhood. Upon review, it was determined by City staff that altering the street sweeping route and schedule would impose a cost increase to residents citywide. As a result of this, the request to modify the existing limited parking zones was denied.

The Police Department is responsible for the enforcement of the parking restrictions during designated street sweeping hours. As the process exists now, the Police

Department follows the street sweeper, and cites vehicles that may be parked during the posted, "No Parking" times. The current cost for a parking citation is \$40.

DISCUSSION

The City's street sweeping services are currently rendered by R.F. Dickson. At this time, City staff is reviewing the contract which governs the services provided, to determine whether a route and potential schedule change is an option for residents. Additionally, City staff is also conducting a field sign survey, to identify the current signage conditions related to street sweeping.

City staff will inform the Traffic Commission of their findings in regards to these items at a future meeting.

DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**


