6. ITEMS FROM THE RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Ron Noda, Acting Deputy City Manager

- The City's contract with the Los Alamitos Unified School District (LAUSD) has expired effective November 18, 2020 on the joint use of Oak and McAuliffe fields. The LAUSD now oversees the allocation and maintenance of those fields.
- The City of Los Alamitos oversees the allocation for athletic purposes of Laurel, Orville Lewis and Cottonwood Parks. We are currently updating and redesigning our reservation request forms.
- Laurel Park is currently closed for rehab maintenance and will reopen on February 2, 2021.
- Orville Lewis and Little Cottonwood Park is experiencing a gopher issue and staff increased abatement program weekly. Staff is currently working on installation of a foot-high metal mesh fence around the perimeter to detract/decrease these critters.
- Banners of Honor is not associated with the City. These banners were displayed hanging from light poles on Katella Avenue. Nancy Karmelich, a resident of Los Alamitos, established a non-profit organization Banners of Honor. These banners were permitted by the City; these banners have a shelf life of three years and were scheduled to be removed in June 2020. In December of 2020 the City reached out to Nancy to replace the banners at which time she notified the City that she is no longer a local resident and relinquished the banners to the City.
- The City of Los Alamitos will tentavily provide a year around Banner Program.
- Public Works Department is replacing the arterial signage in phases (main streets only, no residential). Recreation will be selling these signs to benefit the Department's Scholarship Program. Revenue generated from these sales will benefit the Los Alamitos Scholarship Program.
- Furloughs for the City has been completed. The City will remain on the same schedule and will be closed on Fridays. Please know that the Recreation Department will continue to have classes after hours and on Fridays with a staff member on-site.
- Announced that he will no longer be regularly attending the PR&CA Commission meetings. Please direct all Recreation, Facilities, Parks, Field, inquiries, etc. questions to Emeline or Megan. You may always call or email with City questions or concerns. May attend one-two meetings annually related to Fields/City items

for discussion/presentation. Thank you for serving on the PR&CA Commission and has enjoyed working with each and every one of you. This is not a farewell, as he will see you around at most of the community events.

SUMMARY

This report provides the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission an opportunity to provide input on the movie options for the 2021 Drive-Up Film and Food Fest Event Series.

RECOMMENDATION

Commission review and recommend movie choices for the 2021 Drive-Up Film and Food Fest Event Series.

BACKGROUND

In response to the success of the 2020 Drive-Up MemorialCare Miller Children's & Women's Hospital Long Beach Music and Movies Event Series, the City of Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department developed the Drive-Up Film and Food Fest Event Series. This series consists of six (6) drive-up movies, food available to purchase from food vendors, and the distribution of themed goodie bags. The event series takes place on various Fridays from August-October and tickets are \$10 per vehicle.

DISCUSSION

The Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department invites the community to attend the Drive-Up Film and Food Fest Event Series with neighbors, friends, and family again in 2021.

This year, there will be six (6) events on various Fridays taking place from August-October. Food is available to purchase from food vendors at 7:00 p.m. and the movie is scheduled to begin at approximately 8:00 p.m. Recreation staff are in the process of securing a location for this year's Drive-Up Film and Food Fest Event Series. Listed below are the event dates:

- Friday, August 6
- Friday, August 20
- Friday, September 3
- Friday, September 17
- Friday, October 1
- Friday, October 15

Attachment #1 is the Commissioner's voting sheet. Commissioners will find the voting sheet to have each Drive-Up Film and Food Fest date. Under each Drive-Up Film and Food Fest date will be four (4) movie choices. Commissioners are asked to rank the movie choices for each date from #1 – #4, with #1 being their first choice. In the event of a tie, Recreation staff will provide the tie-breaking vote.

The Commission previously voted on the movie for Friday, August 6 during the Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Arts Commission meeting on Wednesday, January 6. The Commission voted for the movie "Trolls World Tour- rated PG" to be featured at the Friday, August 6 event date. As a result, Friday, August 6 is not listed on Attachment #1 or Attachment #2.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for the event is provided by the Recreation and Community Services Department budget in the Special Events budget. In 2020, MemorialCare Miller Children's & Women's Hospital Long Beach's sponsorship assisted with offsetting the event budget. Funding from ticket sales, food vendors, and sponsors will further assist with offsetting the budget.

Brief Movie Synopses

Friday, August 20

- “Remember the Titans” (2000) Rated PG – The true story of a newly appointed African-American coach and his high school team on their first season as a racially integrated unit.
- “Kicking and Screaming” (2005) Rated PG – Family man Phil Weston, a lifelong victim of his father’s competitive nature, takes on the coaching duties of a kid’s soccer team, and soon finds that he’s also taking on his father’s dysfunctional way of relating.
- “Cars” (2006) Rated G – A hot-shot race-car named Lightning McQueen gets waylaid in Radiator Springs, where he finds the true meaning of friendship and family.
- “The Mighty Ducks” (1992) Rated PG – A self-centered Minnesota lawyer is sentenced to community service coaching a rag tag youth hockey team.

Friday, September 3

- “The Secret Life of Pets” (2016) Rated PG– The quiet life of a terrier named Max is upended when his owner takes in Duke, a stray whom Max instantly dislikes.
- “Zootopia” (2016) Rated PG – In a city of anthropomorphic animals, a rookie bunny cop and cynical con artist fox must work together to uncover a conspiracy.
- “Madagascar” (2005) Rated PG– A group of animals who have spent all their life in a New York zoo end up in the jungles of Madagascar, and must adjust to living in the wild.
- “Doctor Dolittle (1998) Rated PG-13 – A doctor discovers that he can communicate with animals.

Friday, September 17

- “Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse” (2018) Rated PG – Teen Miles Morales becomes the Spider-Man of his universe, and must join with five spider-powered individuals from other dimensions to stop a threat for all realities.
- “Incredibles 2” (2018) Rated PG – The Incredibles family takes on a new mission, which involves a change in family roles: Bob Parr (Mr. Incredible) must manage the house while his wife Helen (Elastigirl) goes out to save the world.
- “Big Hero 6” (2014) Rated PG – A special bond develops between plus-sized inflatable robot Baymax and prodigy Hiro Hamada, who together team up with a group of friends to form a band of high-tech heroes.

- “The Lego Batman Movie” (2017) Rated PG – A cooler-than-ever Bruce Wayne must deal with the usual suspects as they plan to rule Gotham City, while discovering that he has accidentally adopted a teenage orphan who wishes to become his sidekick.

Friday, October 1

- “Monsters, Inc.” (2001) Rated G – In order to power the city, monsters have to scare children so that they can scream. However, the children are toxic to the monsters, and after a child gets through, 2 monsters realize things may not be what they think.
- “Monster House” (2006) Rated PG – Three teens discover that their neighbor’s house is really a living, breathing, scary monster.
- “Monsters vs. Aliens” (2009) Rated PG – A woman transformed into a giant after she is struck by a meteorite on her wedding day becomes part of a team of monsters sent by the U.S government to defeat an alien mastermind trying to take over Earth.
- “Scooby-Doo 2: Monsters Unleashed” (2004) Rated PG – The Mystery Inc. gang must save Coolsville from an attack of their past monsters brought to life by an evil masked figure trying to take down the gang.

Friday, October 15

- “Halloweentown” (1998) Rated TV-G – When a young girl living with her good-witch grandmother learns she too is a witch, she must help her grandmother save Halloweentown from evil forces.
- “The Haunted Mansion” (2003) Rated PG – A realtor and his wife and children are summoned to a mansion, which they soon discover is haunted, and while they attempt to escape, he learns an important lesson about the family he has neglected.
- “Hotel Transylvania” (2012) Rated PG – Dracula, who operates a high-end resort away from the human world, goes into overprotective mode when a boy discovers the resort and falls for the count’s teenaged daughter.
- “Paranorman” (2012) Rated PG – A misunderstood boy takes on ghosts, zombies, and grown-ups to save his town from a centuries-old curse.

BACKGROUND

The Recreation & Community Services Department staff have noticed a gap in programming offered within the City Recreation Brochure. While Special Olympics has filled a bit of that void, Recreation staff hope to increase adaptive programming even further to provide additional opportunities and resources for individuals with special needs.

DISCUSSION

Adaptive programming for children, teens, and adults with special needs has been discussed and staff are ready to move forward in the planning and implementation of these programs. The plan is to start small with a life skills and enrichment course. The program will include topics such as social skills, art, crafts, fitness, financial management, independence, employment preparation, and connections to local resources. Once the Life Skills & Enrichment course is successful, we would like to add the following genres to our class options: art, dance, fitness, and sports.

Staff researched other surrounding cities' offerings which included free classes on life skills, hygiene, arts and crafts, field trips, dances and Special Olympics sports movie nights. As the program develops in Los Alamitos, staff will consider adding more activities similar to other cities.

FISCAL IMPACT

Recreation staff are currently researching grants and partners to provide programming for minimal or no cost to the participants.

SUMMARY

This report provides the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission a preview of the Week of Los Al, My City My Los Al Street Fair, Bikes & Bites, Race Los Al.

RECOMMENDATION

Commission receive, discuss, and provide feedback and/or recommendations.

BACKGROUND

Over the last 10 years, the Los Alamitos Recreation & Community Services Department has added a wide array of events to the annual City calendar. Each event varies in size ranging from 100 in attendance to 15,000+. The team has brainstormed new events to keep the community engaged and create memories for families throughout the entire year. Events have served many purposes connecting residents to businesses, non-profits, churches, and other local organizations. They have proved successful in uniting the community, creating safe spaces for families to see their neighbors and classmates, and in providing a memorable experience around many holidays and seasons.

The Los Alamitos Recreation & Community Services Team is a dynamic team of enthusiastic Recreation professionals with goals to serve the community in the best possible way. Events are a highly enjoyable aspect of the duties among the core team from pre-planning to execution of the events with the great satisfaction of seeing smiles on children's faces and generations of families joining together and returning year after year.

DISCUSSION

The Recreation staff have brainstormed another event comprised of several events taking place in one week. September 11 through the 18 is planned as the "Week of Los Al." The week will be retro theme as displayed in the graphic below to highlight the City's incorporation in 1960's and celebrating the different decades leading up to today.



Kicking off with Serve Los Al on September 11, which will be the 4th annual Citywide Volunteer Service Event, Serve Los Al will begin the week-long celebration of the Week of Los Al. During the week, various in-person activities (pending COVID-19 restrictions in place at the time of the event) and virtual activities are scheduled to take place including:

September 12-September 17:

In-person activities:

- An after school Arts & Crafts Workshop
- Family Day style activities similar to the modified event offered in 2020
- Film & Food Fest Event at L.A.Y.B. Parking Lot (Friday, September 17)

Virtual or take home activities:

- Take home activity kit to benefit the Recreation Scholarship Fund
- Social Media contests
- Tik Tok dance challenge from each decade
- Art Contest for display at My City My Los Al Street Fair
- Video why you love Los Al
- Staff interactive videos (Finish that Lyric or Name that Song)

September 17-18 In-Person Events (pending COVID-19 restrictions):

- Race Los Al – this event entails moving Race on the Base from February to September and moving the event off the Base and back on to the streets of Los Alamitos as the event historically began 40 years ago. This will be the 40th Anniversary of the event. The intent is to generate more local participation from the residents and businesses as the Race on the Base draws more of a regional attendance. The race will be a retro theme with various races being planned. Moving the race back to the streets of Los Alamitos allows more flexibility in race proceeds benefiting other City events to offset costs. Originally the Race on the Base proceeds benefitted the pool at the Los Alamitos Joint Forces Training Base, which the City is no longer in charge of operations. The proceeds then benefitted the 4th of July Fireworks Spectacular at the Joint Forces Training Base, however, the event will have already passed by September.
- My City My Los Al Street Fair including a vendor fair, farmer's market, food and beverage booths, live bands, art walk, entertainment, and children's activities
- Bikes & Bites Los Alamitos Restaurant Tour (9-18-21 only)

Participants to these events are encouraged to bike or walk to the event. Bikes and Bites was such a popular new event last year with great success during COVID-19. Many families biked, walked, took their scooters or skateboards and enjoyed visits to the 10 local participating restaurants of the event. Staff are working with other organizations to seek alternative parking locations and are planning out the course and scope of the event.

FISCAL IMPACT

Sponsors are currently being sought for the Week of Los Al and Race Los Al events. To date, Southland Credit Union has committed to \$20,000 of the presenting sponsor level of the Week of Los Al. MemorialCare Miller Children's & Women's Hospital Long Beach has been approached to be title sponsor of the Week of Los Al and is expected to have a final decision in the next week. New sponsor Financial Partners has also been approached to sponsor Race Los Al and will also be deciding soon on their partnership package. Following the large scale sponsor opportunities, staff will be seeking other lower level sponsors to support the events. Race Los Al will be offset by participant entry fees.
