1. CALL TO ORDER

The Traffic Commission met in Regular Session at 7:02 p.m. on Wednesday, May 11, 2022 in the Council Chamber, 3191 Katella Avenue, Los Alamitos, CA, Chair R. Hill presiding.

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

4. ORAL COMMUNICATION

Chair R. Hill opened the meeting for Oral Communication for items not on the agenda. There being no speakers, Chair R. Hill closed Oral Communications.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

7. STAFF REPORTS

A. Citywide Striping and Pavement Marking (CIP 21/22-02)

Development Services Director Noda summarized the staff report.

Commissioner Mejia asked and received clarification from Development Services Director Noda about paint that will be used depending on the area.

Commissioner Salai asked if the oil paint would have any slip and Development Services Director Noda confirmed it would not be.

Commissioner D. Hill asked if the left turn lane going westbound on Cerritos Avenue going south on Los Alamitos Boulevard is long enough. Development Services Director Noda confirmed that it is, but per the project it will be elongated.

Commissioner Salai shared her experience of how busy the lane gets.

Chair R. Hill also shared his experience on Cerritos Avenue and Los Alamitos Boulevard.

Chair R. Hill asked if this project is a result of the success of the Old Town West striping project. City Engineer Kelly clarified that half of the project is in Old Town West to finish the striping in the neighborhood. Development Services Director Noda added that should a neighborhood have a traffic issue; the City could go in and do the same striping that was done in Old Town West.

Chair R. Hill asked about the Briggeman Drive area of the project and how the right turn lane into Briggeman Drive is an issue for large trucks. Development Services Director Noda clarified that Briggeman Drive will be widened to accommodate for the large trucks that turn into the street.

Chair R. Hill then asked about the construction work on Cerritos Avenue if the striping would be pushed until after the completion of the project. Development

Services Director Noda confirmed that the striping will still take place as the striping should not be affected by the large trucks.

Commissioner D. Hill asked about the bike lane on Bloomfield Avenue.

Commissioner Salai asked if there would be any striping changes to the west of Los Alamitos Boulevard right turn lane on Chestnut. Development Services Director Noda confirmed that there should not be a change, just additional verbiage on the street.

Commissioner Mejia shared that there were reflectors in areas (Los Alamitos Boulevard and Katella Avenue) with right turn lanes. Development Services Director Noda shared that this will be discussed with the Traffic Engineer Iranitalab.

8. ITEMS FROM THE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DEPARTMENT

City Engineer Kelley provided an update on the two street projects:

- CDBG Howard and Bloomfield project
 - Grind and overlay the streets, fix some curb and gutter
 - See the contractors out there next week
- Measure Y project should start in June

Development Services Director Noda shared that Golden State Water Company will be doing a project in Rossmoor that will be closing Wallingsford Street for a couple days. He reached out to the General Manager of Rossmoor to recommend for them to start after school ends.

Development Services Director Noda reminded TC to do their form 700 and harassment training. Also introduced the new Civic Clerk program.

9. TRAFFIC COMMISSION INITIATED BUSINESS

Commissioner D. Hill asked about the bike plan for the City. Development Services Director Noda clarified that the plan (Active Transportation Plan) is completed and can be accessed on the City website.

Chair R. Hill mentioned that there will not be bike lanes going all the way down Los Alamitos Boulevard.

Commissioner Salai shared her concern of the no pickup/drop off at the Community Center parking lot and asked if there are any other area for staff to park. Development Services Director Noda shared that staff has permission to park in the Epson parking lot on Tuesday and Thursdays.

Commissioner Salai also shared her concern of the parking issue during minimum days as the Community Center has their classes going on at the same time the adjacent middle school is let out. Development Services Director Noda shared that the City has reached out to the Principal of Oak Middle School, and that the Police Department is aware and are figuring out how to mitigate the issue.

Chair R. Hill asked if the commissioners had comments about the Traffic Commission status log.

Subject: Findings Required by AB 361 for the Continued Use of Teleconferencing for Meetings

SUMMARY

For the Traffic Commission to continue to have the option to meet via teleconference during the pandemic, AB 361 requires the Traffic Commission to make specific findings at least every thirty (30) days.

RECOMMENDATION

Make the following findings by a majority vote of the Traffic Commission:

1. A state of emergency has been proclaimed by California's Governor due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and continues to be in effect;
2. The Traffic Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
3. State and local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19.

BACKGROUND

Assembly Bill 361 (AB 361) was signed into law by the Governor on September 16, 2021. A portion of AB 361 enacted amendments to California Government Code section 54953 regarding teleconference meetings. Those amendments authorize local agencies, like the City, to continue to conduct meetings by teleconference during a Governor-proclaimed state of emergency provided that certain findings are made by the legislative body, and provided that certain procedural requirements are met regarding public access to the meetings. A "teleconference" occurs for purposes of AB 361 whenever one or more members of the City Council connect to a City Council meeting via electronic means. Thus, even if four members of the City Council meet in person, if the fifth joins the meeting via Zoom, the meeting will be a teleconference meeting that must be conducted in accordance with the requirements of AB 361. For purposes of AB 361 "... 'state of emergency' means a state of emergency proclaimed pursuant to Section 8625 of the California Emergency Services Act..." Cal. Gov't Code Sec. 54953(e)(4). Section 8265 of CESA in turn refers to a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor.

A new requirement in AB 361 requires specific findings be reaffirmed at least every thirty (30) days in order for the Traffic Commission to continue to have the option for one (1) or more of its members to use teleconferencing.

DISCUSSION

Required Findings

The teleconference provisions in AB 361 may only be utilized as long as a Governor-proclaimed state of emergency remains active, or while state or local officials have recommended measures to promote social distancing. When either of those is the case (both are true at this time), then in order to continue to teleconference using the new provisions of AB 361, the Traffic Commission must make the following findings by majority vote every 30 days:

(A) The Traffic Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and

(B) Either of the following circumstances exist:

1. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or
2. State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing (Cal Gov't Code Sec. 54953(e)(3)).

To comply with that requirement, the recommended action would have the Traffic Commission find each of the following:

1. A state of emergency has been proclaimed by California's Governor due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and continues to be in effect;
2. The Traffic Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
3. State and local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19.

The "Every 30 Days Thereafter" Requirement

As noted above, AB 361 findings must be made "no later than 30 days after teleconferencing for the first time pursuant to , and every 30 days thereafter..."

In order to preserve the option for the Traffic Commission or individual members of the Traffic Commission to participate in meetings during the pandemic via teleconference in the future, the Traffic Commission will have to adopt the required findings at least every 30 days.

Potential Consequence of Not Making the Findings Every 30 Days

AB 361 does not expressly state what happens if a legislative body fails to make the required findings "every 30 days." However, it expressly requires the timely re-approval of the findings "in order to continue to teleconference" in the manner that AB 361 authorizes.

As a result, if the Traffic Commission does not adopt the required findings every 30 days, then the Traffic Commission could be precluded from continuing to teleconference thereafter, perhaps even if the Traffic Commission was later willing to adopt the findings at a later date. For this reason, the City Attorney recommends that the Traffic Commission adopt the required findings at this time and at least every 30 days thereafter, unless the Traffic Commission decides as a permanent matter that it will no longer permit teleconferencing at all (e.g., regardless of whether the state of emergency worsens).

Procedural Requirements for The Conduct of Teleconference Meetings

AB 361 contains several new requirements for the conduct of teleconference meetings with which the City has prepared to comply. Specifically, each meeting must:

1. Allow members of the public to attend and comment at the meeting via call-in option or internet-based service option;
2. Protect the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties and the public appearing before the legislative body;
3. In the event of disruption which prevents broadcasting the meeting or which prevents members of the public from offering public comments via the call-in or internet-based option, the Traffic Commission must take no further action until the disrupted public access is restored;
4. The City may not require public comments to be submitted in advance, and must offer the opportunity for the public to offer comments “in real time” during the meeting; and
5. The public must be allowed “a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow members of the public to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register , or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

BACKGROUND

Streets are among the most important public assets as well maintained streets provide safety and positive aesthetic for the community. The following are the streets that is part of Phase I of the Street Improvement Project.

- Florista Street
- Cherry Street
- Toland Circle
- Kaylor Avenue
- Fenley Drive
- Holden Circle
- Katella Avenue Frontage
- Paseo Bonito
- Lampson Frontage
- Del Norte Way
- El Dorado Way
- San Joaquin Avenue
- Toland Avenue
- Antietam Avenue
- Kearsarge Avenue
- Siboney Street
- Lunar Drive

- Olympic Drive
- Satellite Drive

If approved at the June 13, 2022 Council meeting, Phase II of the Street Improvement Project will commence for fiscal year 2022-23. Staff has recommended streets for maintenance but there is an opportunity to gain feedback from the Commission on other possible streets to include in Phase II.

DISCUSSION

As part of the City's overall street improvement plan, the City proposed to grind and overlay or slurry seal the following streets as part of phase II of the Street Improvement Project.

- Catalina Street
- Florista Street
- Noel Street
- Calle Lee Avenue
- Corporate Center Drive
- Glacier Circle
- Vicksburg Circle
- Carlsbad Circle
- Interior Circle
- Ranier Circle
- Apollo Circle

SB-1 Street Project

- Tripoli Avenue
- Mindora Street
- Bennington Street
- Howard Avenue

The Street Improvement Project will also replace damaged curb and gutter, lifted sidewalks, correct drainage issues, and A.D.A. ramp curb ramps will be modified to current codes as necessary for accessibility.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this project is included in the 2022-2023 adopted budget and includes funds from Measure Y and SB-1.


